Location

The college is located on a beautifully landscaped 300 acre campus in the town of Twin Falls. This is a medium sized town in a rural farming part of the country with many community activities, parks, movie theaters and outdoor recreation. The local people are characterized as being friendly, hard working, family and community oriented. The area is surrounded by distant mountain ranges and the Snake River to the north of the city.

Climate

South Central Idaho has a four -season climate. Daytime highs in summer are about 91 while winter temperatures typically range from about 37 in the daytime to 19 overnight. The city receives relatively little precipitation, about 17 inches of snow and 9 inches of rain each year.

Housing

Students may live in a traditional style dormitory which also has an activity center, computer lab with internet access, study rooms, game room, and laundry facilities. Two people share a room with the bathroom down the hall. Rooms are equipped with a study desk, bed, closet/dresser and chair. You provide your own linen, blankets, pillow, towels and other items that add to the attractiveness and comfort of your room. There is a cafeteria for meals.

Sports

Intercollegiate competition for men is available in baseball, basketball, cross-country, track and rodeo. For women, there is basketball, cross-country, track, rodeo and volleyball. The intramural program offers competition in various coed sports: flag football, ultimate frisbee, basketball, golf, volleyball, softball, wallyball, and much more.

Activities

If you like the outdoors or sports, CSI is a great choice. The Outdoor Programs department offers students the opportunity to enjoy activities such as kayaking, skiing, canoeing, camping, hiking, ropes courses and rock climbing. Bus trips are arranged to local resorts for skiing, snowboarding or ice skating. There is a wide variety of clubs to join such as the band, horse club, intercultural club, ski club, judo club, French club and many more.

Transportation

While living on campus, a car is not necessary but may be convenient to go to other towns or get around during bad weather. Public transportation is limited.

Campus Facilities

The campus has all of the facilities to make your experience successful and enjoyable. There is a theater, gymnasium, athletic fields, tennis courts, student health center, library, art and science center and even one of the best planetariums in the country.
