## Location

The historical downtown of Laramie has quaint shops, restaurants, art galleries, movie theaters and a warm, friendly atmosphere. Here you will find a true “Western Spirit” as you would imagine from an old western movie while the university provides diversity and cultural sophistication. Wyoming is located in the Rocky Mountains where outdoor activities like skiing and mountain biking are abundant.

## Climate

This area experiences 4 distinct seasons, with very cold winters and significant snow fall. Summer temperatures average about 30C and winter can be as low as -12C with snow.

## Activities

Enjoy the many campus activities and clubs that UWYO has to offer. The Theater, Dance and Music departments present a variety of performances each year. You can attend an intercollegiate sporting event and cheer on the “Cowboys” with your friends. There are fraternities and sororities on campus which you may join in order to participate in many social and community activities. Wyoming offers a great variety of outdoor activities and sights, such as: Yellowstone National Park, Vedauwoo rock formations, Devil's Tower and popular hot springs.

## Transportation

On campus you won't need a car. Students may use the free campus shuttle. Downtown Laramie can be reached by foot, but a bicycle would be better. A car is definitely recommended when you want to visit places outside of Laramie.

## Campus Facilities

The campus consists of residence halls, classroom buildings, cafeteria, library, basketball stadium, football stadium, 2 gyms (with indoor swimming pools), theater, museum, American Heritage Center, computer labs, bookstore, student organisations, bowling alleys, restaurants, hairdresser and much more.
